


# 25 Years of Service!!

#### Notre Dame Pedi Pals Program expands

As the largest provider of Pediatric Palliative Care in Massachusetts, Notre Dame At Home is now caring for pediatric patients residing in the Merrimack Valley area.



Notre Dame At Home has been caring for children in Central Massachusetts diagnosed with life limiting illnesses since 2012. Notre Dame's "Pedi Pals" program is part of a state wide pediatric patient care network, funded by the Department of Public Health. Notre Dame's "Pedi Pals" program has flourished and now cares for more than 100 children and their families. Recently, with the help of additional funding approved by the state, an additional 40 children will be able to receive services on the "Pedi Pal" program. The supportive services are offered to address many of the unmet physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs of children with life-limiting illness and their families.

# Notre Dame At Home is chosen to participate in a pilot program

Notre Dame At Home is the only Hospice in Central Massachusetts chosen to participate in a pilot program funded by Medicare that will provide services to their beneficiaries facing serious illness. Notre Dame At Home, as part of the Notre Dame Health Care's Continuum of Care is now able to

offer an additional choice for people with a serious illness. This new and innovative program offers, Choice, Continuity of Care, Care Coordination, and



assistance Navigating Healthcare Choices. These choices "empower clinicians, beneficiaries and their families with greater flexibility in deciding between hospice care and curative treatment when faced with life limiting illness."
